- Basic technology skills in communication and education

- 3+ years of teaching experience
- Experience with standards-based teaching and assessment
- Experience with Reader's & Writer's Workshop models of instruction
- Experience with creating inquiry-based learning environments

Expectations

- Be open to expanding and adjusting teaching practice to match the mission and vision of our school.
- Manage classrooms and implement school procedures; work with school leaders and administrators to initiate policies.

- Collaborate with colleagues to create daily lesson plans that are engaging, productive and valuable for students, encouraging them to want to come to school.
- Deliver lesson plans in a way that catches the attention of students and keeps them engaged and excited about learning.
- Develop, administer, and grade in-class, standards-based assessments.
- Select reading, writing, math and other curriculum-development materials, including textbooks, in accordance with grade level expectations and goals.
- Meet one-on-one with students to improve performance and address behavioral issues; hold conferences with parents and guardians as needed.
- Watch closely for students who are struggling with emotional problems, learning disabilities or situations at home, and help them find the resources they need.
- Grade papers and homework regularly to provide constructive feedback to all students.
- Seek additional educational knowledge and stay up to date on new methods by joining professional organizations, attending continuing education courses and attending regular training sessions for teachers.
- Weave goals, competencies and objectives into lesson plans in ways that directly apply to the student's life.
- Create a positive and healthy classroom climate for learning. Utilize the PBIS (positive behavior interventions and supports) structure to manage behavioral outcomes.

Characteristics of a successful KPIS teacher

- Effective at speaking in front of groups, both children and adults, and accomplished at inspiring children to learn.
- Willing to contribute positively to the implementation of school initiatives.
- Manages a classroom with diverse students and different learning abilities.
- Establishes classroom rules to hold each student accountable and build a strong classroom community.
- Expertise in teaching English Language Arts, mathematics, social studies, and science curriculum for elementary-aged and additional-language learning students.
- Consistent and present in all students' lives. Young students thrive on regular schedules, so keeping with a set routine is important for all teachers.
